<p>Topic: Find a game that was played during Victorian times and create a PowerPoint / poster explaining the rules and how to play it.</p>	<p>Topic: Research The Great Exhibition. When did it happen? Where? What was exhibited? Who attended? How did they get there?</p> <p>Please write your research up (in your own words) in a paragraph which is perfectly spelt and punctuated.</p>	<p>English: Create a mindmap for the four main word classes and add examples for each. You could extend your mindmap further by including the different types of nouns and adverbs</p>
<p>Topic: Find out how long Kings and Queens of the past have reigned and make a bar chart to compare with Queen Victoria's reign. Don't forget to label your chart!</p>	<p>Topic / Maths: Find a picture (or take a photo) of a traditional Victorian house and glue it into your book. Make a list of all the different shapes that you see. Which quadrilaterals can you see?</p>	<p>English: Write a menu for one meal that you have had at home this week. Using adventurous vocabulary and descriptive language try and make it sound as exciting as possible.</p>
<p>Topic: Using books or the internet, find out about Victorian food. Choose a recipe and try to make it! What was it like? Did you like it? Did your family like it? Write a paragraph to explain who they are and why you have chosen them.</p>
<p>Topic: Design your own homework task linked to our topic. You might put your crafty, arty, or building skills to good use! Or, carry out some research into something to do with our topic that you would like to find out about in more detail. The only limit is your imagination!</p>	<p>RE: We are continuing to focus on religious practices and lifestyles within Buddhism and Christianity. Remind yourself of last term's learning on meditation. Choose a point in your weekend for a moment of reflection and stillness. Will you use something to clear your mind – music, songs, images, a special place? Write a short paragraph to explain what you did and how long you were able to focus on relaxing and reflecting. How did it make you feel?</p>	<p>Music: Using a verse or chorus from a favourite song, try and rewrite the lyrics to demonstrate a "Going for Goals" theme.</p>
<p>Science: Draw a diagram of the eye. Label the following parts: lens, optic nerve, pupil, iris, cornea, and retina.</p>	<p>Science: Experiment and see how light creates shadows. Take photographs or draw pictures of these objects with the light shining from 3 different angles. How does this change the shadow?</p>
